Context challenges	The school has moved through a transition of administration at the end of the last review cycle, with the school at the stage of rebuilding agreed best practice and shared understandings across all areas of the school. The school supports approximately 10% of the student population working with the Programme for Students with Disabilities and approximately 15% of students from a non-English speaking background.
Intent, rationale and focus	The primary focus of this strategic cycle is to build practice excellence across all areas of the school. This will be supported by clearly defined and supported instructional and shared leadership across the school. Developing consistency of practice in planning and assessment and an acknowledgment of shared responsibility for improving outcomes for all students is a key element.
