Today the staff undertook professional learning across a number of different areas.

### Student Voice and Agency

- As a staff we explored our own understanding of student voice and agency, but also how we define these at concepts our school.
- We also spent time identifying the current practice at APPS, and making a commitment to action to ensure our practice and awareness improved.
- There will be more shared regarding Student Voice and Agency in coming communications.

### Learning Intentions and Success Criteria

- Ensure all students know what they are going to learn and where they are heading.
- Provide guidance to teachers on what their chosen teaching and learning activities are seeking to achieve.
- Provide the basis for feedback and reduce discrepancies between current student understanding and intended learning.
- Assist students and teachers in tracking and assessing student progress.
- Help teachers to understand the impact of their teaching and learning activities, and when they may need to adapt or change these.
- Help students understand what improved performance looks like.

# Community Understanding and Safety Training (CUST).

### Learning and Teaching at APPS

### 6+1 Traits of Writing

At APPS we are now using the shared language of the 6+1 Traits of Writing to help our students become better writers. The 6+1 Traits of Writing Model is a research-based tool to develop high quality writing skills in our students.

Students write every day! As students move the process of writing (Planning, Drafting and Writing, Revising, Editing and proofreading, and Publishing) we can talk and use the traits at every part of the process.



The **6+1** *Traits* of *Writing* outlines a set of characteristics commonly featured in pieces of

high-quality writing. By knowing and recognising the traits, teachers can analyse student writing to identify the specific skills and content students must acquire to develop proficiency as a writer.

They can then use these traits understandings to help students learn those specific skills necessary to make their writing really work, and to give feedback about how to improve specific writing pieces. You will see information of the **6+1** Traits of Writing around the school as the year goes on, and as students become more familiar with the language they will start to talk about their writing using "trait language".

By using the common language of the traits, we are all talking about the same thing - it helps the language both teachers and students use to talk about the features, qualities and parts of our writing to be specific and focussed.

#### The 6+1 Traits of Writing are:

- Ideas: The main message
- **Organization:** The structure of the writing.
- Voice: The way the writer brings the writing to life
- Word Choice: The words used to help express the ideas
- Sentence Fluency: The rhythm and flow of the writing.
- **Conventions:** The general rules of writing

• **Presentation:** The overall appearance of the piece

### From the Office




Just Brass will be starting up again on Monday afternoons at Ainslie Parklands.
