Harmony Day - Sunday 21st March

March 21 is Australia's Harmony Day, which celebrates the country's cultural diversity. It coincides with the United Nations' International Day for the Elimination of Racial Discrimination. Harmony Day is an attempt to acknowledge the contributions of multicultural communities to Australian society. It is celebrated with many community festivals and local events with global food and music and traditional dress.

Orange is the colour chosen to represent Harmony Week as it signifies social communication and meaningful conversations. It also relates to the freedom of ideas and encouragement of mutual respect.

From Tuesday 11th to Thursday 13th May, students from Year 3 and Year 5 will be engaged in reading, writing and maths assessments as part of the National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN).

As many of you would be aware, the decision was made to not run the NAPLAN assessments in 2020 due to the impact of COVID-19. In 2021 the process will run in a very similar fashion as it has in previous years. F-2 Unit of Inquiry News

F-2 children have been focussing on developing their inquiry and research skills. Recent student questioning sparked an investigation into how communities function and work in other countries. Students considered how they might research into this and James in Foundation suggested "We could FaceTime another family in another country and ask them questions about their community.

"Working with his wonderful idea, we arranged a video meeting with some classes from my school in Singapore that I used to work at. Our APPS children were extremely excited to connect with the Singapore

American International School students and have a tour of their classroom (which we found out is very similar to ours!). Next week, we will write letters to the students at SAIS and ask them questions about their school and local community that they are part of.





On Friday the 12th March, the F-2 students had an exciting time exploring our local community. They were INQUIRERS and OBSERVERS, as we walked, looked, wondered, observed and recorded. We discovered lots of interesting parts of our community, and wondered about what these things brought to our community?

We explored ideas such as "keeping us safe", "helping people get around", "having fun" and "people coming together". We walked three loops, allowing us to have our snack at the Gladys Grove Park – where we had lots of fun! We saw houses, shops, traffic, signs, repair people, bus stops, pets, and much, much more!





On Friday we went on an Excursion. First, we put our lunch boxes in Carolyne's car and then we started walking. We saw dogs. We also saw a Basketball place. We did it with the Foundations.

Then we had snack and then we had recess. We went back to walk again. We saw a dead bird. It was disgusting. We saw tiles at the bus stop. It is for blind people they have a cane. There is a ball on the can that is very sensitive. When the ball hits the yellow tiles the person knows they are at the bus stop so they are safe
